



Writing a Case Report

For many clinicians, a case report is their first venture into publication. But writing up a case is not to be underestimated: the short format can make it hard to fit in all the relevant details in a coherent and readable form. In this workshop, you can learn how to do that.

Part 1 – Theory

- When should I write a case report?
- What journal should I publish it in?
- What sections does a case report have?
- What information should I present in each section?
- How can I structure my manuscript so that it is logical and interesting?

Part 2 – Practice

- Participants bring their own first drafts with them.
